SIX REASONS TO SAY “NO” TO VACCINATIONS

#1: Pharmaceutical Companies Can't Be Trusted

Let's just list a couple of the (many) times over the past 10+ years where a drug or drug regimen has been deemed unsafe and downright dangerous and yet the pharmaceutical companies covered it up FOR YEARS in order to continue raking in the profits for as long as possible. This should be an easy task.

How about hormone replacement therapy for women? The standard of care for a menopausal woman for over 40 years was HRT. Even women with no complaints were advised that this treatment was helpful as it reduced chances for a heart attack and cancer and even helped them feel younger. Were ANY of these claims true? Not a whit. Breast cancer risk is doubled for women on HRT; 41% increased risk for stroke; 29% increased risk of heart attack, and the list goes on and on.

How about Vioxx? Before this dangerous drug that caused thousands of deaths from heart attack and stroke was finally removed from the market, evidence surfaced that Merck had withheld information and even doctored reports on its dangers years before. As of November, 2007, Merck had agreed to pay \$4.85 billion to settle approximately 27,000 from cases claiming injury or death of a family member using Vioxx. While this is a huge sum of money, in reality it represents less than one year's profits for Merck. Does it pay for a drug company to lie about a drug's safety and efficacy? You betcha. The risk of payouts to victims from getting sued is lower than the lure of huge and long lasting profits while a drug's patent protection remains in effect. These corporate behemoths have proven themselves to be completely untrustworthy based on past behavior. In a court of law, if such a company were an actual witness, an attorney would never put them on the stand due to a serious lack of credibility. Are you really going to take these companies at their word that these shots are safe when money and profits are impacted by their answer?

#2: ALL Vaccines are loaded with Chemicals and other Poisons

Here is a list of some of the damaging ingredients in the vaccines on the market today: MSG, antifreeze, phenol (used as a disinfectant), formaldehyde (cancer-causing and used to embalm), aluminum (associated with Alzheimer's Disease and seizures), glycerin (toxic to the kidneys, liver, can cause lung damage, gastrointestinal damage and death), lead, cadmium, sulfates, yeast proteins, antibiotics, acetone (used in nail polish remover), neomycin and streptomycin. And the ingredient making the press is thimerosal (more toxic than mercury, a preservative still used in many vaccines, not easily eliminated, can cause severe neurological damage as well as other life threatening autoimmune disease). These vaccines are grown and strained through animal or human tissue, like

monkey and dog kidney tissue, chick embryo, calf serum, human diploid cells (the dissected organs of aborted fetuses), pig blood, horse blood, and rabbit brain.

Can you imagine injecting this stuff directly into your child's blood? At least if you ate these ingredients, your body would have a chance to detoxify and eliminate them before any permanent damage could be done. But, to inject them right into the blood is the most damaging and lethal approach imaginable. How could anyone possibly think injection of such a cocktail of poison could in any way help preserve and enhance your child's health? (Sarah says), "It sure didn't make any sense to me. And, here I am 12 years later, still very happy with my decision NOT to vaccinate my children. Sadly, I know many Moms with 20/20 hindsight who greatly regret their decision to vaccinate". [It has been proven by independent biological scientists that infant vaccines cause autism and Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS)—DT]. However, I don't know ANYONE who has not vaccinated and regrets their decision.

#3: Fully Vaccinated Children are the Unhealthiest, Most Chronically Ill Children I Know

One thing that confounds me is that there are no studies comparing the health of unvaccinated children to the health of vaccinated children. This seems like such an obvious study and it should have been conducted decades ago. Why hasn't it been done yet? My guess is because the health of the non-vaccinated children would so totally blow away the health of the vaccinated children that the discussion about the dangers of vaccines could finally be put to bed and the case would be closed emphatically in favor of those that accuse shots of causing chronic illness and auto immune disease. Update since this post was written: Vaccinated children are found to be more chronically ill than unvaccinated children with rates for autism, ear infections, ADHD, asthma and allergies as much as 30% higher than unvaccinated children. Take an informal poll of the folks in your circle and see for yourself. The kids with the most problems— allergies, asthma, ADHD, autism, coordination and other gross motor issues, etc. sure seem to be the ones that are right on track with their vaccination schedule. Even more powerful, ask Moms with several children, some of whom are vaccinated and some who are not. In my own circle, the Moms I know who have one or two older kids who are fully vaccinated and the younger kids who did not get any shots tell me that, hands down, that the unvaccinated children are healthier and have less problems.

#4: Other Countries Are Waking Up to the Dangers of Vaccines

In 1975, Japan raised its minimum vaccination age to 2 years old. The country's infant mortality subsequently plummeted to such low levels that Japan now enjoys one of the lowest level in the Western world (#3 at last look). In comparison,

the United States' infant mortality rate is #33.

In Australia, the flu vaccine was recently suspended (April 2010) for children under 5 because an alarming number of children were showing up in the emergency rooms with febrile convulsions or other vaccine reactions within hours of getting this shot. Need I say more?

#5: A Number of Vaccines Have Already Had Problems/Been Removed from the Market

Here is a brief list of some of the vaccines that have caused serious injury in recent years:

In February 2002, GlaxoSmithKline removed the Lyme disease vaccine from the market citing poor sales when in fact a number of folks who received the vaccine reported symptoms worse than the disease itself such as incurable arthritis or neurological impairment.

The Rotavirus vaccine (Rotashield) was removed from the market in 1999 due to an association between the vaccine and life threatening bowel obstruction or twisting of the bowel. Interestingly, my pediatrician at the time (who was a life-long friend of our family) had highly recommended that this vaccine be given to my newborn baby at the time. I trusted my instincts and said no to the shot—am I glad I did! My pediatrician (remember, lifelong family friend) subsequently dropped me as a patient. Guess he wasn't such a friend after all!

A warning was issued concerning the second Rotavirus vaccine (Rotateq) in 2007 as it caused the same twisting of the bowel problem in 28 infants (16 of which required intestinal surgery). This second vaccine has not yet been removed from the market as far as I know.

Another vaccine that has had a lot of problems but is not yet withdrawn is the Gardasil vaccine for adolescent girls. Fainting, paralysis, slurred speech are just a few of the reactions reported and yet this vaccine continues to stay on the market. At least 1600 adverse events have been reported since its approval in 2006, yet doctors are continuing to recommend this shot to their patients. Why this vaccine hasn't already been removed from the market is astonishing.

If the vaccines above have had serious problems, the others probably do too as vaccine manufacturers follow the same basic formula when coming up with each new shot.

#6: You Can Always Get Vaccinated, But You Can never undo a Vaccination

Procrastination is usually considered a character flaw, but in the case of vaccination, delaying the decision for as long as possible plays to your advantage. The longer you wait to vaccinate your child, the better. A child's immune system continues to develop for years after birth. The blood/brain barrier does not fully develop until

Standing there, looking out over the pasture, it all looks great, secure, normal, except for this open gash in the fence where it's broken to the ground.

On my way back into the house, I stopped by to check on the horses. The mini was calmly lying down-perfectly content and safe. My horse came over to give me a kiss. Then as I passed my son's truck bed,

Then there followed the dark sin at Eder when in a moment of uncontrolled passion he gave himself up to lust and violated his father's concubine, Bilhah Gen. 35:22. The sorry episode proved to be a symptom of a deep and crippling problem. **Reuben lacked basic self-discipline**, a weakness that disqualified him for the birthright privileges of leadership and prosperity.

On his deathbed Jacob touched upon his son's tragic character flaw.

Unstable as water, you shall not have pre-eminence because
you went up to your father's bed; then you defiled it.

tucked inside were all the garden plants I bought just before the storm, safe and sound, not a broken stem in them. The truck sheltered them from the horrific wind, and while there was flying sticks and debris all around them, over-top of them, they weathered the storm, and were just blessed by the rainfall to water their thirsty roots.

You're probably wondering what in the world all of that has to do with Joseph. I've been reading about his life and choices, and the society and temptations that he lived in. It brought out the fact that he grew up in a morally corrupt home, with family that lied, and were sexually corrupt, etc.; so his values weren't exactly caught/taught from family history. Today I read about how Potiphar's wife tried and tried to seduce him, and his refusal to comply with her commands. I thought about how quickly the temptation of sin can rip apart our lives, and leave us lying in ruins. As I was thinking about how it looked when I got home, as the storm was in the distance; the strength of the storm when it hit, and the damage that it wreaked as it tore through, I thought about those little plants, and how they were totally safe, tucked in the shelter of the truck bed, how our only safety from sin, is to be tucked in the shelter of God's loving arms, sheltered in the cleft of the rock. Then no matter what temptations, storms of life, etc. come flying our way, we can, like Joseph, come out victorious.

When the brothers were debating what to do with Joseph, Reuben suggested that they should abandon him in a dry well instead of killing him. His advice saved the lad's life. He planned to return later and secretly rescue Joseph. But Reuben might just as easily have persuaded his brothers to leave the young man alone. When he had discovered that they had sold Joseph into slavery, he wailed, "And I, whither shall I go?" He thought only of himself and gave little consideration to the fate of his young brother or his bereft father.

Years later, during the famine, Joseph demanded Benjamin's physical presence in Egypt as a prerequisite to his brothers purchasing food. Afterward Reuben reminded them, "Did I not tell you not to sin against the lad? But you would not listen. So now there comes a reckoning for his blood" Gen 42: 22) It was a pathetic cry of a basically good but grossly ineffective man. Saying "I told you so" is often the sound of frustration in the soul of a weak-willed Reubenite.

Back in Canaan, the brothers faced Jacob with the painful prospect of sending Benjamin back to Egypt with them, or starving. Reuben stepped forward with a rash guarantee, "Slay my two sons if I do not bring him back to you; put him in my hands and I will bring him back to you (verse 37). Of course that would be a relatively safe offer. Why would a father avenge the loss of two sons by slaying two grandsons? They were all his own flesh and blood.

Only when Judah promised to stand security for Benjamin did their father agree to the proposal. Judah's gifts for sound leadership kept coming to the fore, and ultimately he would take over this part of the birth-right privileges from Reuben.

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MONTHLY HEALTH NUGGET

Our Blood vessels

The circulatory pathways have been discussed in the article on the Heart. This month we will look at the Blood Vessels themselves.

The **blood vessels** are the part of the circulatory system that transports blood throughout the human body. There are three major types of blood vessels: the arteries, which carry the blood away from the heart; the capillaries, which enable the actual exchange of water and chemicals between the blood and the tissues; and the veins, which carry blood from the capillaries back toward the heart. The word *vascular*, meaning relating to the blood vessels is derived from the Latin *vas*, meaning vessel. A few structures (such as cartilage and the lens of the eye) do not contain blood vessels and are labeled.

Structure

The arteries and veins have three layers, but the middle layer is thicker in the arteries than it is in the veins:

- *Tunica intima* (the thinnest layer): a single layer of simple squamous *endothelial cells*.
- *Tunica media* (the thickest layer in arteries): circularly arranged elastic fiber. The tunica media may (especially in arteries) be rich in *vascular smooth muscle*, which controls the size of the vessel.
- *Tunica adventitia*: (the thickest layer in veins) entirely made of connective tissue. It also contains *nerves* that supply the vessel.

Capillaries consist of little more than a layer of *endothelium* and occasional connective tissue.

When blood vessels connect to form a region of diffuse vascular supply it is called an *anastomosis* (pl. anastomoses). Anastomoses provide critical alternative routes for blood to flow in case of blockages.

There is a layer of muscle surrounding the arteries and the veins which help contract and expand the vessels. This creates enough pressure for blood to be pumped around the body. Blood vessels are part of the circulatory system, together with the heart and the blood.

What is the difference between Arteries and Veins?

Arteries

Vessels which carry oxygenated blood from the heart to the various parts of the body.

Arteries have elastic muscular walls. No valves are present.

Blood flows under pressure.

Veins

Vessels which carry deoxygenated blood from the various parts of the body toward the heart.

Veins have thin non-elastic walls.

Valves are present to prevent backflow of blood.

Blood flows under pressure.

While his mother had envisioned a strong decisive character in her son, the primary imagery associated with Reuben's personality is that of water. Water may be very powerful in the form of steam, but its natural tendency, where left alone is to flow downward, accommodating itself passively to any available situation. A Reubenite, in other words, is "unstable as water". He only flows with the tide. Yet water also has many wonderful, positive properties as well - as did Reuben with his easygoing, kindhearted nature and his heart full of noble purposes that somehow never got fulfilled.

Reuben's emotional ailment's filtered down into his tribe. On the borders of Canaan, Dathan, Abiram. and On, leaders of his clan, ambitiously joined the rebellion of Korah, hoping to reclaim the civil authority lost to their family (Num. 16:1 With such a vigorous leader to follow, the Reubenites took up the cause. Lacking the capacity for leadership in the rebellion, the malcontents asserted themselves primarily through loud, insolent talk.

There were no outstanding people - no kings, prophets, or decision-makers among them.

When Deborah and Barak mustered the troops at Mount Tabor to fight Sisera, Reuben failed to respond. Still dogged by instability and indecision, its members could not make up their minds whether to join or not. They had no backbone for hard challenges. Consistently they chose the easier way, which in this case was to stay at home. None the less they debated about the matter. **"Among the clans of Reuben there were great searchings of heart,"** but still they tarried. Insensitive and unresponsive as sheep, they missed the joy of sharing the Lord's battle.

The Reubenites repeatedly capitulate to temptation because they lack goals and fixed principles to guide them. Like moral chameleons, they let every wind of change in their circumstances sway or mold them. Yet, anyone willing to undergo "searching of heart" can't be all wrong. Such self-examination can lead to repentance and complete forgiveness. In God's providence, members of this tribe will be among those who will receive the seal of God. Rev. 7;7 and make their way into the kingdom. And from the walls of the golden city the name of this one-time unstable son beckons the weak though well-meaning to struggle through the Reuben gate. If they choose, the grace of God will make this possible.

adolescence. The longer you wait, the more likely your child's immune system will be able handle the onslaught with minimal damage. *If you don't know what to do, don't do anything!*

Conversely, you can never undo a vaccination. There are holistic therapies that can detox a child from the vaccine's poison, but the damage that is done can never be 100% repaired. And, I have NEVER met a fully vaccinated child that is healthier and more robust than a well-nourished, unvaccinated child. Period.

While I would like to convince you to never vaccinate your child, if I can simply convince you to delay it for a few years that is certainly

better than vaccinating a baby. If you can simply commit to waiting until your child is school age to vaccinate, so much the better than if you vaccinate as a toddler and so on. Time is on your side and waiting is the best policy when it comes to shots.

By the time your child is older, more research will have been done, you will have an opportunity to learn more and become more comfortable with your decision to wait. Who knows? Your attitude of wait and see may turn out to be permanent.



MY TESTIMONY BY BETH RUEHL

I was born and raised in Kenosha, WI to a German factory worker (American Motors Corp) and a Polish store clerk (Piggly Wiggly). I also have an older sister and brother. As an infant, I was baptized into the Methodist church and was taken to Sunday school and church weekly. At 13 or 14, it was expected that I be confirmed and so I agreed. During my years up until 8th grade, I attended a Lutheran grade school. But by the age of 14, I had become confused and curious about religion. My sister had left the Methodist church, became a vegetarian and started attending a Seventh-day Adventist Church, where she became a colporteur. Not long after that, she

invited me to a Revelation seminar. My dad had died when I was 12, and when my mom heard about this “new” church, she thought it was a cult. But I was so impressed by the fact that everything they taught was supported by Scripture that I was eager to learn more.

I attended public schools from 9th through 12th grade but when I graduated high school in 1982, my interests had peaked about Adventism so much that I had a deep desire to attend Andrews University in Michigan. The summer after my high school graduation, I worked for a Jewish family in Illinois as a nanny. This was a unique experience. I had become a vegetarian, but

didn't have a clue about the correct way to prepare vegetarian dishes so it was a learning experience. Filled with excitement, I started my first year at AU, but after the first quarter, I left. Not only did I suffer from severe homesickness, but the whole Adventist world, which was so new to me, came as a complete shock while being alone and away from home with no one to guide me. Later I wanted to return to AU and did. I was baptized November 3rd, 1984, by Pastor David Rand.

After my baptism, I completed my B.S. degree at Andrews University, worked for a while, and then returned in 1993

History

Origin of Mother's Day goes back to the Ancient Greek annual spring festival dedicated to Rhea wife of Cronus and mother of many Greek mythology deities.

Romans have a spring festival called Hilaria dedicated to as Cybele also a mother goddess. Cybele was 250 years before Christ, and was celebrated during the Ides of March and lasted 3 days. This celebration was banned from Rome.

Roots can also be traced in the UK where it is referred to Mothering Sunday. This dates back to the 1600s. Early Christians celebrated Mothers Day on the 4th Sunday of lent in honor of the Virgin Mary. England expanded it to honor all mothers. The custom almost died out by the 19th century however it was celebrated again after WW2 when an American Serviceman brought the custom and commercial enterprises and used it as an occasion for sales.

Julia Ward Howe first suggested celebrating Mother's Day in 1872 here in America. She suggested June 2nd to be celebrated for Mother's Day and that it should be dedicated to peace. She wrote the Mother's Day Proclamation in Boston in 1870.

The Original Mother's Day Proclamation by Julia Ward Howe

Here for records sake, is the proclamation she wrote in 1870, which explains, in her own impassioned words, the goals of the original holiday.

Arise, all women who have hearts,

whether your baptism be that of water or of tears! Say firmly: "We will not have great questions decided by irrelevant agencies, our husbands shall not come to us, reeking with carnage, for caresses and applause.

"Our sons shall not be taken from us to unlearn all that we have been able to teach them of charity, mercy and patience. We women of one country will be too tender of those of another country to allow our sons to be trained to injure theirs."

From the bosom of the devastated earth a voice goes up with our own. It says, "Disarm, disarm! The sword is not the balance of justice." Blood does not wipe out dishonor nor violence indicate possession.

As men have often forsaken the plow and the anvil at the summons of war, let women now leave all that may be left of home for a great and earnest day of counsel. Let them meet first, as women, to bewail and commemorate the dead. Let them then solemnly take counsel with each other as to the means whereby the great human family can live in peace, each learning after his own time, the sacred impress, not of Caesar, but of God.

In the name of womanhood and of humanity, I earnestly ask that a general congress of women without limit of nationality may be appointed and held at some place deemed most convenient and at the earliest period consistent with its objects, to promote the alliance of the different nationalities, the amicable settlement of international questions, the great and general interests of peace.

BUT:

The first celebrated Mother's Day in America was in 1908 by Anna Jarvis when she held a memorial for her mother at St. Andrews Methodist

Church in Grafton West Virginia. Anna Jarvis though herself never married nor did she have any children, honored her mother amidst a growing negligent attitude of adult Americans towards their mothers. By 1911 Mother's Day was celebrated in almost every state of the Union and on May 8th 1914, Woodrow Wilson signed a Joint Resolution designating the 2nd Sunday in May as Mother's Day and proclaiming it a national Holiday. It is to be a public expression of our love and reverence for all mothers. This Celebration is observed by 40 plus countries with dates that vary by that country.

Its significance is to honor Mothers and Motherhood.

This is just a little history on Mother's Day.

Today's commercialized celebration of candy, flowers, gift cards and meals out, bears little resemblance to Howe's original Idea.

I feel we need to go back to the 5th commandment.

Exodus 20:12a NIV Honor thy Father and thy Mother

By doing so we have a promise from God, and that promise is

Exodus 20:12b so that you may live long in the land the LORD your God is giving you.

I do not know about you but I honor my mom every day. Yes there is one day (actually a few) that is set aside for her specifically.

So to all the Ladies reading this Happy Mother's Day. To my mom Happy Mother's Day every day. Love to my mom always.....

Is God Working In My Life?

How many times have you asked the question "Is God really leading in my life? I don't feel like I'm doing anything for Him!" Perhaps I'm the only one who's ever felt that way. I am in the process of reading a whimsical story with some serious undertones with the shady title of "*Flash: The Homeless Donkey Who Taught Me about Life, Faith, and Second Chances*" by Rachel Anne Ridge. It's published by Tyn-dale House Publishers and is the true tale of a stray donkey who wandered onto a family's country property and stayed, teaching them, as the title suggests, something about faith and life.

Rachel was a missionary's daughter, went to Bible College, and had the dream of doing great things for God. Instead, she settled down with her husband, had three kids, and started their own business. Life started to take over: their fourth child was stillborn and their business, which held so much promise, suffered ups and downs. What happened to God in her life and all the amazing things she was going to do for Him? Here is what she says:

"Faith had often been presented as an either-or proposition: Either you are a 100 percent willing vessel or a halfhearted church attendee.

A minister or a pew sitter. A doer or a spectator. An on-fire

zealot or a pallid Christian. There wasn't much middle ground to speak of. It took years of plodding to realize that there was, after all, a place for us, and it was not in a manufactured state of guilt, but in a grace-filled space within His care.

Faith, we learned, is not an occupation, but a lifestyle. It is a matter of the heart that encompasses everything. Step by faltering step, we had made a trail from the woods to the barn, from hyperactive duty to genuine worship. Circling around and coming back.

Making dinner, taking kids to piano lessons, changing the oil. Finding that God is in our work and our play and our family. In our hockey games and Bible studies, our bedtime prayers and errands. He is in our *showing up* each day and lacing up our shoes and being fully present in whatever situations we find ourselves. He is in our very breaths.

Walking, stepping, plodding. Doing the next thing....And one day, waking up to embrace the freedom of the mystery. Savoring the not knowing. Resting in faith. Being in awe of a God who sees and knows, and who waits. It all happens in such incremental moments, as you work out your life into some kind of reflection of Him in your everyday world. You are making trails, even when you don't know quite where you are heading.

Psalms 32:8 says, 'I will...guide you along the best pathway for your life. I will advise you and watch your progress.' (TLB) How incredible to know that His hand is leading and His eye is watching over us. And Proverbs 16:9 states, 'We can make our plans, but the final outcome is in God's hands.' (TLB)

[I thank] God for all the times during my journey that I'd begged for rescue, for change, for intervention—and God in His inscrutable wisdom had left me just where I was. Because it was in the waiting, and the wondering, and the plodding that I had to do the most trusting. And found the most grace.

You can't always see the destination, but perseverance will take you there. He is with you each step of the way. Always."
