Do I Have a Testimony?

“Can you give your testimony?” The question scared me. The worship coordinator looked down at me expectantly. She was putting together a youth church service for fifth Sabbath, and was asking four young people including fourteen-year-old me to give 5-minute sermonettes in place of the normal sermon. Stage-fright gripped me; what could possibly be so interesting to share about myself?

I said “yes” because I had not yet learned the art of saying “no” - something the faithful few who are burnt-out need to learn - but as the week progressed the nervousness increased. It would be nice to say I overcame my fear, had a great revelation, and gave a stellar testimony that brought tears to everyone’s eyes. Not exactly. I did give a short testimony, and people seemed to like it, but nothing groundbreaking happened.

Since then, God has taught me some les-

sons regarding testimonies, and here are four of them...

Lesson 1: A “testimony” is not a sermon, though it can be given during sermon time. The Bible uses the word “testimony” as a legal term: it is a witness, a statement, a recounting of the facts. Revelation 12:17, says that all of God’s followers have a testimony about Jesus. He is the defendant, and you are His witness called to testify about Him, to convince the jury (everyone else) in this judgment hour of His innocence and love. Your testimony is simply you saying, “Hey, I’m friends with this God-man named Jesus who happens to be the Creator and Redeemer of the world, and this is what He’s done for me!” A testimony does not have to be your life story; it can be as simple as “Yesterday I was at the grocery store and Jesus did this...” We should be giving testimonies all the time, not just at church.

Lesson 2: Your testimony is not about you, it is about God. Do not make it about you. That was what frightened

me; what can I say about me? But you are just recounting your relationship with Jesus. Of course, this means you will not have a testimony if you do not have a personal relationship with Jesus. Granted, if you do have that close relationship, you will find it hard to keep quiet!

Lesson 3: Your testimony does not have to be amazing. No one in the courtroom is judging the witness who takes the stand on how exciting and unbelievable their answers are. The veracity of their story is what matters. Fourteen-year-old me was scared because my life seemed pretty boring compared to most testimonies: I had not experienced a horrible accident and almost died, or lived a scandalous life of sin and done drugs or gone to prison, or been a missionary in some far-away jungle and fought snakes and tigers. Those bells and whistles might get people’s attention, but the love of Jesus is what will soften and convict the heart.

Lesson 4: Still think you do not have a testimony? Well, you can

always ask God for one. It is a dangerous (and wonderful) prayer to ask God to give you a testimony. Ask that of Him in faith, and your life will change in ways you could never have imagined. The next year, when I was fifteen, something happened that changed my life forever. I have shared that story with some in the district, and maybe I will share more in a future newsletter; but suffice it to say God definitely gave me more testimonies.

It is essential that we tell our testimonies: Rev. 12:11, says that we triumph over Satan by the blood of the Lamb and by the *word of our testimony*. Are you telling others about what Jesus has done for you?

Lift up your eyes on high

There is something awe inspiring about the night sky for the stars speak to us of God. I first became aware of this almost 60 years ago when our Almond church had an evening social at the home of Harlow and Jane Peterson. I was only 9 or 10 years old and my cousin, Albert Krohn, asked me if I'd like to go outdoors and look at the stars. Albert taught 8th grade science for many years and he was very good at what he did. As we stepped outside into the late summer evening we both marveled at the beauty of the night sky. Albert pointed out the ruddy planet Mars hanging above the horizon in the east. He showed me the Big Dipper and how to use the dipper to find the North Star. We saw the Teapot and the Northern Cross. Albert pointed out Vega, Deneb and Altair – the stars that form the Summer Triangle. The Milky Way arched across the sky that night and something “clicked” in my mind. I've had a love of the stars and the science of astronomy ever since. We should never underestimate the influence we might have on a young person!

Now fast forward to the spring of 1976. This was shortly before my wife and I were married and for one last time, I accompanied my parents on a road trip to Las Vegas to visit my sister and her family. My little telescope and camera platform had been packed away in the trunk of the car for I was aware that Comet West was about to pass close to the sun and then reappear in the morning sky. It promised to be quite spectacular. Rising three or four hours before sunrise, I made my way out of the light pollution of the city and headed down the road toward Hoover dam. With the city behind me I pulled off the road into the desert and set up my scope. As my eyes became dark adapted I could see the stars as I had never seen them before. Thousands of pinpricks of light extended from horizon to horizon. And then what looked like a search light beam slowly rose in the east. Then the head of the comet became visible and I was absolutely enthralled. For the next hour I took picture after picture, stopping only now and then to enjoy the visual treat of the nighttime sky under pristine conditions. I will always treasure the memory of that morning and the pictures I was able to capture are still hanging on my wall.

In Psalm 19:1-3 we read, “The heavens declare the glory of God; and the firmament sheweth his handiwork. Day unto day uttereth speech, and night unto night sheweth knowledge. There is no speech nor language where their voice is not heard.” And it's true, the night sky {speaks” a universal language that appeals to all. We see the same stars here in North America as they do in Europe, the Middle East and Asia. We see the same stars that Adam saw and Noah and Abraham. And so, as the weather begins to get warmer, make an effort to find a clear dark sky and “Lift up your eyes on high, and behold who hath created these things...” Isaiah 40:26. Let the grandeur of the starry night speak to your soul of God's love.

ZEBULUN - the Wanderer, or Traveler

Leah gave her 6th son a name meaning “to dwell,” or “a wish for habitation.” She may have hoped that her husband would reward her by living with her with more love and appreciation (Gen 30:20).

Zebulun may well have been the most unusual child in the whole family. His curious personality had an interesting out-working, not only in his own life, but in the ultimate destiny of the tribe. He could be characterized as a wanderer and a traveler. As a result of his travels he developed into a writer and an artist, and wielded an influence that spread far beyond his local horizon.

Zebulun’s tribal sign was a ship (Gen 49:13) sailing out into the sunset.

Except for one obscure judge, Elon (Judges 12:11-12), and an army general, Eliab (Num 2:7), the tribe of Zebulun produced no individuals of Biblical note. Yet, in one respect, they were absolutely unique. A hardy pioneer tribe, they took up an occupation that no other group in Israel dared follow. Zebulun fell in love with ships.

This is unusual, for Israelites were desert born and bred and tended to have an aversion for the sea.

Upon entering Canaan, the tribe settled near Samaria, an attractive, fertile area (Judges 12:12) Later, however, they moved northward toward the sea. Zebulun and some Asherites joined in the bustling commerce coming from the sea-ports. Their lives fulfilled the prophet’s word of Jacob.

“Zebulun shall dwell at the shore of the sea: he shall become a haven for ships, and his border shall be unto Sidon (Gen 49:13).

Zebulun was included with his brother Issachar in the prophetic blessing pronounced by Moses.

Deut 33:18, 19 And of Zebulun he said, Rejoice, Zebulun, in thy going out; and, Issachar, in thy tents.

Jacob predicted that;

Zebulun shall dwell at the haven of the sea; and he *shall be* for an haven of ships; and his border *shall be* unto Zidon. (Gen 49:13) And so it turned out that Zebulun did become a voyager whose cargo vessels “sucked the abundance of the seas and of the treasures hid in the sand” and brought him wealth.

While Issachar would prosper staying at home, Zebulun was to rejoice in “going out” (Deut 33:18, 19).

Like many of the other tribes, Zebulun **did not** drive out the Canaanites. They all lived together – but with one notable difference. Zebulun placed the local inhabitants under tribute, thereby keeping the upper hand (Josh 19:10-16).

Zebulun and Issachar, whose land lay immediately to the south, are often mentioned together (Gen 35:23; 46:13,14; Deut 33:18) Unlike Simeon and Levi, however, they became helpful partners who complimented one another. Being near the same age, they had, no doubt, enjoyed each other as boyhood playmates. Since like often attracts unlike, Issachar the plodder would naturally have been fascinated with Zebulun the adventurer. With their matching talents, the two tribes shared a joint blessing, lying as they did between the Sea of Galilee and the Mediterranean:

Sitting astride the great trade route to Egypt, Zebulun and Issachar also shared the privilege of taxing the passing cara-

The Healing Power of The Lemon

Lemon And Bad Breath: Drink lemon juice drinks sweetened with a little honey, two (2) to three (3) times daily to *guarantee* sweetness of breath.

Lemon And Gum Disease:

Pyorrhea: or periodontitis refers to an advanced stage of periodontal disease in which the ligaments and bones that support the teeth become inflamed and infected. It is usually a result of gingivitis, a periodontal disease that infects the gums. **Several prominent dentists prescribe the juice of lemon and salt for stubborn cases of pyorrhea.**

Athletes Foot And Lemon Juice: Athlete's foot can be rectified without high priced ointments. Combine equal parts of Lemon juice with papaya juice to take care of this situation.

Lemon Juice And Cataract: "Dr. Gerald Stahl reports innumerable cases of cataract which have been eradicated by using drops of half lemon juice and half distilled water in the eye three (3) times daily." *The Use Of Remedies God's Medical Kit Mamon & DyerRhonda Wilson*

Lemon Juice And Asthma: Dr. Joseph H. Greer cured his patients of asthma by giving them two (2) tablespoons of lemon juice before each meal, and before retiring, in addition to a general detoxifying diet (especially elimination of liquid flesh-dairy).

Thick Catarrh (Mucous) And Lemon: A teaspoonful of olive oil with a teaspoon of lemon juice can be gradually—through a dropper—allowed to trickle through each nostril. It can also put into the ears each week for cleansing and tonic properties.

LEMON JUICE/ACNE

1. Ensure your skin is clean.
2. Squeeze 1 teaspoon of lemon juice into a small bowl. Use a cotton ball to soak up some juice. Dilute it with water if it burns.
3. Dab the juice onto your pimples, whiteheads, blackheads, and pimples.
4. Leave on over night and rinse in the morning. Apply it again.
5. If you find the lemon juice too strong too leave on, even diluted with water, wash it off after 10 minutes in cold water.

Expect improvements with this remedy after about 2 weeks.

vans in addition to promoting their own commercial enterprises. With Issachar staying by his tents and Zebulun working the ships, they made a practical team.

Not only did his tribe grow rich and prosperous, it was also missionary minded. On their trips abroad, the mariners of Zebulun called "the people of the mountain" of Zion, "offered sacrifices of righteousness." Wealthy and of good character, an excellent if uncommon combination, the people of Zebulun also became "an haven of ships," offering shelter to the tempest tossed.

And they also went to war. The Song of Deborah and Barak sets the vigor of Zebulun and Naphtali in studied opposition to the apathy of the unresponsive tribes in the battle against Jabin.

The soldiers of Zebulun and Naphtali acquitted themselves well during the battle led by Deborah, for they "jeoparded, or exposed, their lives unto the death in the high places of the field." (Jud 5:18) The prophetess noted that "out of Zebulun they handle the pen of the writer"(Judges 5:14). Fearless and helpful, literary and generous, "they took no gain of money."

And when David was preparing for his coronation, he was backed by eager supporters from "Zebulun, such as went forth to battle, expert in war, with all instruments of war, fifty thousand, which could keep rank: they were not of double heart" (1Chron 12:33). What a wonderful testimony Inspiration has left for them!

The tribe of Zebulun also joined Issachar and Naphtali in bringing liberal stores of food to celebrate David's victory. 1Ch 12:40 brought bread on asses, and on camels, and on mules, and on oxen, *and* meat, meal, cakes of figs, and bunches of raisins, and wine, and oil, and oxen, and sheep abundantly: for *there* was joy in Israel

Deborah mentions that they "handle the pen of a writer." Our western alphabet came from the Phoenicians, who passed it on to the Greeks. In their business relationships with the Phoenicians, the Zebulonites would have to have learned their letters in order to compete in the business world. Listings of cargoes, bills of sale, barter, and exchange, documents of taxation and duties – all called for writing ability. As men of business, the Zebulonites were qualified to make the decisions and take the risks that their situation demanded.

In the worship of God they were just as enthusiastic. During Hezekiah's reformation "diverse...of Zebulun (from the northern kingdom) humbled themselves and came to Jerusalem... to keep the feast of Unleavened Bread" (2 Chron 30:11-13). Rich, prosperous and enterprising, gifted, artistic and literary, brave, organized, and masters of themselves,

On February 22, Dawn Hahn will be conducting a cooking class, which will start about 6:00.


March 29, we will have an agape feast. Time to be determined.
