"The Final Blessing"

All things must come to their conclusion. Only one reality lasts forever, and that is when God makes all things new (Revelation 21:5). When I hear the parable of the Good Samaritan, my mind usually dwells on those three pedestrians that are walking down the country road, the three men that each saw the poor, broken man lying in the street helpless and needy. The focus of my attention is usually fixed on the callous indifference displayed by the first two passers-by and the true compassion displayed by the "good Samaritan" who went out of his way to help the injured victim, suffering, in pain and lying by the way. I think we are drawn in, asking to put ourselves in the place of these three passers-by who have by some chance, been brought to the scene of the crime, a witness,

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Weimar NEWSTART Program and the Eight Laws of Health #7

The Weimar NEWSTART Program uses the acronym NEWSTART to address the eight laws of health; N=Nutrition, E=Exercise, W=Water, S=Sunshine, T=Temperance, A=Air, R=Rest, and T=Trust in God. This article will focus on rest. The information is taken from seminar notes.

Scientists do not know why the seventh-day cycle is so common in cultures around the world – unlike days, months, and years the week is not based on any solar or lunar pattern. As followers of Bible truth, we know God initiated the week during Creation. He created the Sabbath day and sanctified and reserved the Sabbath for spiritual and physical refreshment.

"We have an internal, biological 7-day cycle too – after organ transplants, rejection is higher in days 7 and 14."

Rest is essential both to physical and mental health. Almost 1/3 of our life is spent sleeping – 8 out of 24 hours a day. While we sleep our bodies heal and repair themselves and our mental faculties are restored.

The best sleep occurs in the hours before midnight. Some of you have heard the old saying, "Early to bed, early to rise, makes a man healthy, wealthy and wise." It's pretty accurate!

The best restoration of our bodies occurs before midnight. Every hour you sleep before midnight counts as double restoration and repair! There are five stages of sleep and these stages repeat themselves throughout the night, so our bodies repair and restore throughout the night. But the best healing and restoring of our bodies occurs before midnight. So, we see the importance of going to bed early. By the way, for repair, our entire body needs to rest including our stomachs. One reason why illness and disease are rampant in our western culture is that so many of us eat late and then go to bed late. It's recommended we eat no later than four hours before going to bed. If our bodies struggle to heal and repair during the night, disease can more easily set in.

It's also important to go to bed and rise in the morning about the same time every day, even on the weekends. It's good for our bodies.

Getting six or less hours of sleep a night is bad for our health. Getting less than six hours of sleep promotes acidic conditions in the body. Studies show sleeping only 6 hours per night increases heart disease by 18%. Also, levels of insulin were found to be 50% higher than those sleeping 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours. Losing three hours of sleep can decrease the immune system function by 50%. A tired immune system can overlook pre-cancerous cells, giving them a chance to multiply. Lack of sleep increases risk of depression.

Getting nine or more hours of sleep is also bad for our health. Sleeping more than nine hours increases heart disease by 37% and the risk of heart attacks by 45%. In addition, sleeping more than nine hours per night is not good for our brains, increasing the odds of mental health.

If you have trouble sleeping here are a few recommendations:

Wake up with the sun - sunlight increases levels of alertness.

Eat a balanced diet rich in plant-based carbohydrates and tryptophan.

Tryptophan is an amino acid necessary for producing serotonin and melatonin. Tryptophan is found in tofu, pumpkin seeds, sesame seeds, almonds, walnuts, black eyed peas.

Get more exercise.

Avoid tobacco, alcohol and caffeine.

Go to bed early, 2-3 hours before midnight.

Sleep in the dark.

Go to bed on an empty stomach. Do not eat within four hours of going to bed.

Don't take your troubles to bed with you!

Be not like the foolish virgins, who take for granted that the promises of God are theirs, while they do not follow the injunctions of Christ. Christ teaches us that profession is nothing. "If any man will come after me." He says, "let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow me." ...

When we stand the test of God in the refining, purifying process; when the furnace fire consumes the dross, and the true gold of a purified character appears, we may still say, with Paul, "Not as though I had already attained, either were already perfect: but I follow after.... This one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind, and reaching forth unto those things which are before, I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus."

not to the crime itself but to the result of the carnage, a witness to the outcome of sin. Human brutality on display, to this poor soul, robbed and beaten, in need of medical services, presumably a matter of life or

death. Without care, this feeble man would soon die.

I wish to ask you, if we have ever contemplated what manner of man this victim was? As humans, we see pictures of starving children, and our hearts cry for them. We have compassion and empathy for them. But if this struggling man were a gang member, a child sex offender, a terrorist or the likes of a man that shoots up a room full of grade school children, our compassion is not there. So often, when hearing about one of the many recent mass murders, I have heard people comment, "Well, why didn't he just shoot himself first?"

For these questions we must turn to Jesus for our example. In Luke 15:1 we are told that Jesus would eat and fellowship with publicans and sinners. He didn't shun them away fearing it would tarnish his reputation. He deliberately sought them out, and his purpose was the saving of their souls.

Now here is my question. Have you ever questioned whether this man in the parable of the Good Samaritan was even worthy of being helped? Was he maybe a low life robber, or a scoundrel, maybe a prison escapee waiting for his death sentence to be carried out. In Jesus day, this man could have been searching out and killing Christians. In fact, couldn't this man, once healed, come back to harm the hero who came to his rescue or even bring harm to the family of that hero. How do we know that the world would be a better place with this person gone?

The Scripture tell us not only to love our neighbor as ourselves, but that we are to love our enemies, to do good to those who hate us, to forgive the sins of those who trespass against us. If our neighbor slaps us on one cheek, we are to turn so they can strike us again on the other cheek.

Now the Scriptures seem to tell us very little about who that injured man was but I think that person is you and me, our neighbor, our family. He is anyone of us and he is all of us. All of us are unworthy sinners and yet in the eyes of God, we are family and He has bestowed on us His love and mercy. God is that Good Samaritan that saw us helpless and suffering by the way. God did not consider whether we were criminals or whether we would rebuke Him or turn our backs on Him. He sent His only son to die for us, lowly and retched as we are, to save us from sin, death and the power of the devil. We are all that injured man, and He cared for us, nursed back to health, carried us to the Inn. We are all helpless and broken and Jesus is our "Good Samaritan." He loved us in spite of our sin. He picked us up when we couldn't pick ourselves up and then He carried us. And though we were unworthy, He redeemed us with His Blood and saved us. When we hear the Parable of the Good Samaritan, how can we not surrender our hearts to Jesus as well as seek to be like Jesus, reaching out to our neighbors in need. Look at Matthew 25:45 "Then He will answer them saying "Assuredly, I say to you, inasmuch as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to Me." For all that God has done for us, He implores us to have compassion on others. Matthew 25:34 & 35; "The King will say to those on His right hand, "Come, you blessed of My Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; for I was hungry and you gave Me food, I was thirsty and you gave Me drink; I was a stranger and you took Me In. "

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Prophecy Highlights March 2019

Landmarks of "the Daily" (Introduction)

(Written & Complied by R. LEE -2009)

"Then I saw in relation to the "Daily," that the word "sacrifice" was supplied by man's wisdom, and does not belong to the text; and that the Lord gave the correct view of it to those who gave the judgment hour cry. When union existed, before 1844, nearly all were united on the correct view of the "Daily;" but since 1844, in the confusion, other views have been embraced, and darkness and confusion has followed."

"The Lord showed me that Time had not been a test since 1844, and that time will never again be a test." -

Ellen G. White, The Present Truth, November, 1850, No. 11, page 87.

The above statement from the pen of inspiration in and of itself is very plain and simple to understand. It is also very clear concerning who had the "correct view" of "the Daily" in the book of Daniel. Unfortunately, it has been misunderstood, its meaning has been distorted, and it has been explained away from the obvious import of the plain meaning of the English words that were penned under inspiration. This has been going on now for over 100 years, by Sabbath-keeping Adventists. Laity, ministry and theologians alike have been doing this, so that they can teach other views concerning "the Daily" in the book of Daniel.

And the consequences of this distortion and manipulation of this plain inspired statement, has indeed caused confusion and a departing from the faith, by those who have accepted differing views of "the Daily" in the book of Daniel, from the one taught by the majority of Millerite Adventists who gave the judgment hour cry (that is, those who gave the 1st Angel's message in the Millerite Advent Movement of 1840-44). A number of theologians have been led to reject the Biblical validity of the foundational teaching concerning the Cleansing of the Heavenly Sanctuary commencing in 1844; while other Sabbath-keeping Adventists, have fallen into the error and confusion of re-applying the time prophecies of Daniel 12:11 & 12, in literal days to some end-time event yet in the future.

A simple analysis of the above inspired statement reveals the following truths to the careful reader:

- 1. "I saw" that is, Sister White saw in an inspired, prophetic vision concerning this subject.
- 2. The subject that she saw in vision was "the Daily" in the book of Daniel.
- 3. The word "sacrifice" does **NOT** belong to the text, but was added by man's supposed wisdom. That is, it was added by the translators of the King James Version.
- 4. The Lord gave the **CORRECT VIEW** of "the Daily" in the book of Daniel, to those who gave the judgment hour cry (that is, those who gave the 1st Angel's message in the Millerite Advent Movement of 1840 44).
- 5. When union existed before 1844 among the Millerite Adventists, nearly all were united on the correct view of "the Daily" in the book of Daniel.
- 6. But since the confusion after 1844, other views concerning "the Daily" in the book of Daniel have been embraced, which have resulted in darkness and confusion.

7. The Lord showed Sister White that Time had not been a test since 1844, and it will never be a test again.

The compiler has been blessed over the last eighteen months or more to read many thousands of pages of books, pamphlets, and Millerite periodical articles during the time that the Judgment Hour Cry was being given to the world by the Advent Movement of 1840 – 44. And the majority teaching concerning the "the Daily" in the book of Daniel has been clearly revealed to the compiler through this exhaustive research and can be summarized as follows:

- 1. The word "sacrifice" which is linked together in all five places where "the Daily" in the book of Daniel occurs, does not belong to the Hebrew text, and has been supplied by the translators.
- 2. The Millerite Adventists saw "the Daily" in the book of Daniel as a desolating power or an abomination which symbolized Paganism and its religious rites and practices. This power was removed or taken away in 508 A. D., to make way for the rise of "the transgression of desolation" (Daniel 8:13), or "the abomination that maketh desolate" (Daniel 11:31) which they saw as the Papacy.
- 3. As from the taking away of Paganism in the Roman Empire in 508 A. D., the prophetic periods of the 1290 and 1335 days (that is, the 1, 290 and 1, 335 years) of Daniel 12:11 & 12, ended respectively in 1798 and 1843.
- 4. The more accurate translation "the continual" for the phrase "the daily"—was frequently used by the Millerite Adventists in their writings on this subject. (1 there are some individuals today who consider the use of the words "the continual" in relation to "the Daily" in the book of Daniel as a false teaching that is a departure from the "Judgment Hour Cry" view on this subject. Further, they believe that this alternative translation was brought in by Uriah Smith in his theological books written years after 1844. While the compiler is not an admirer of Uriah Smith's books, in fairness to him, it needs to be documented that the Millerite Adventist writers did indeed frequently use the translation "the continual" in their writings concerning this subject.)

The best way to bring out these historical facts concerning the Millerite view of "the Daily" in the book of Daniel is to let the writers speak for themselves, without comment from the compiler. So extracts from Millerite books, pamphlets and periodicals will be copied dealing with this subject, at the time the Judgment Hour Cry was being given to the world.

By the end of this Study Document the reader should see that the above four summarizing points have been historically verified as being a correct representation of the teachings that the majority of the Millerites had concerning "the Daily" in the book of Daniel. Seventh-day Sabbath versus Ceremonial Sabbaths

This passage, Colossians 2:16, 17 is one of the most misunderstood passages in the Bible. The Bible is plain on the Sabbath.

It was given at Creation (Gen. 2:1-3)

Jesus observed it (Luke 4:16)

Paul observed it (Acts 13:42-44)

And it will be observed in heaven: (Isaiah 66:22, 23).

The Bible mentions two kinds of Sabbaths: The seventh-day Sabbath and the yearly sabbaths.

The seventh-day Sabbath, instituted at creation and part of the Ten Commandment Law, is a weekly reminder of the loving, all-powerful Creator.

The yearly Sabbath relates specifically to the history of Israel.

Colossians 2:16, 17 specifically states "Let no one judge you in meat, or in drink, or in respect of an holyday, or of the new moon, or of the sabbath days: which are a shadow of things to come; but the body is of Christ."

The seventh day Sabbath is a memorial of creation not a shadow of something to come. Hebrews 10:1 connects the law of shadows with animal sacrifice. Ezekiel 45:17 uses the exact same expressions in the exact same order as Colossians 2:16, 17 and connects it all with the ceremonial systems of feasts and sacrifices (meat offerings, drink offerings, new moons, and sabbaths to make reconciliation for the house of Israel.

Leviticus 23:3 discusses the Seventh-day Sabbath.

Leviticus 23:5-32 discusses the ceremonial sabbaths (Passover, verse 5; unleavened bread, verse 6; wave sheaf, verse 10, first fruits, verse 17; trumpets, verse 24; Day of atonement, verses 27-32; tabernacles, verses 34-36). Both the feast of trumpets (verse 24), and the Day of Atonement (verse 32) are specifically called sabbaths.

These annual sabbaths were intimately connected to events foreshadowing Christ's death and His Second Coming. They were designed by God to be shadows or pointers to the coming Messiah.

Leviticus 23:37 uses the language of Colossians 2:16, 17 to describe these ceremonial sabbaths. Leviticus 23:38 distinguishes the ceremonial sabbaths from the seventh-day Sabbaths by using the expression "Beside the sabbaths of the Lord."

Since Christ has come, the shadowy sabbaths of the ceremonial law have found their fulfillment in Him. The seventh-day Sabbath continues to lead us back to the Creator God who made us. God's people will keep it as a distinguishing sign of their relationship to Him. (Revelation 14:12; Ezekiel 20:12, 20).

RECIPE CORNER

Garden Chili

2 (16 oz) cans kidney beans, drained

1 (8 oz) can tomato sauce

4 cloves garlic, crushed

1 and 1/2 cups chopped onion

2 tbsp vegetable oil

1 cup chopped celery

1 cup chopped carrots

1 cup chopped green bell pepper

1 (15 oz) can chopped tomatoes

1 tsp cumin

1 tsp dried basil

2 tbsp chili powder

1/2 cup water

1/2 tsp hot red pepper sauce

1 cup shredded Cheddar cheese

- 1. Combine kidney beans and tomato in a large pot. Cook over med-low heat.
- 2. Sauté garlic and onion in oil in a large skillet over med-high heat for 5 minutes. Add celery, carrots and bell pepper. Cook, stirring occasionally, until vegetables are tender, about 10 minutes.
- 3. Add vegetables to pot; stir. Add undrained tomatoes, cumin, basil, chili powder, water and red pepper sauce. Cook until chili is slightly thickened, about 35 minutes.
- 4. Ladle chili into soup bowls and sprinkle with Cheddar.
