## Calcium, Protein and Milk

The milk-calcium-protein-bone density myth has been created and perpetuated by intense lobbying of the dairy industry throughout the lifetimes of most adults loving today. While in kindergarten and grade school, a great number of the nutrition teaching aids were supplied by the National Dairy Council. As a result, parents, teachers, doctors, lawyers, judges, and significantly, members of congress, have grown up with the not unbiased view that milk is both wholesome and necessary to the daily diet. For several generations, the Council's most effective campaign tool has been to link milk with calcium and bone density.

The dairy industry has not been telling us the truth about the connection between milk and strong bones. Calcium balance, the relationship between the intake and loss of calcium determines bone density, primarily during the growing years and early childhood. If one has a good bone density by the age of 30 , it will usually last a lifetime for those consuming a balanced plant-based diet and remaining physically active.

Milk and other dairy products, although rich in calcium, are excessively high in animal protein, which creates an acid condition and has been shown to create calcium loss from the bones through the urinary tract, in order to neutralize the acid condition. The evidence for this loss is substantial.

A 1994 National Institutes of Health Consensus Statement formulated by an expert panel concluded that calcium balance and bone density depended at least 30\% on the ratio of calcium intake to loss, not on calcium intake alone.

This may explain why countries with the highest consumption of dairy products also have the highest incidence of osteoporosis-and why bone fracture rates in these societies are more closely tied to excess protein consumption than to inadequate calcium consumption. Exceptions exist, but it's interesting that countries with the highest animal protein consumption are the very countries with a higher than normal recommended daily allowance (RDA) for calcium.

Higher animal protein consumption would require a higher intake of calcium to offset the adverse effects of the extra protein!

Elderly South African Bantu women, who consume a very low protein diet (50 grams daily,

[^0]compared to 91 grams for Americans) and only 450 mg . calcium daily, have little or no osteoporosis despite the calcium drain of nursing an average of 10 children.

On the other hand, Eskimos, who are very physically active, consume a very high protein diet (250-400 grams, mostly from fish) and have a calcium intake of over $2,000 \mathrm{mg}$. daily. Yet
they have the highest rate of osteoporosis in the world! So the high protein content of milk-yes, even skim milk-could well undermine its high calcium content. Milk, it now seems clear, is not the solution to the malady of poor bone density. Rather, it's almost certainly a part of the problem.

the dominion of Papacy in the same place; this marks the commencement of the time of the end to be in 1798. The first of these numbers must mark the time to begin the last; if not, there is none given, and it is of course a dead letter, which we cannot admit for a moment. Beginning the two numbers together, and the first ending in 1798, the last must be about ended!! But what is this blessing upon those who wait, and come to the end of these days? and who are they? Paul shall answer: "We [saints] shall not all sleep, [die,] but we shall all be changed in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trump. Then we [saints] which are alive, and remain, shall be caught up together with them [risen saints] in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air." But do you say that many wicked will wait, and come to this same time? They will indeed come to it, to their everlasting sorrow; but it is only true saints who "wait for his Son from heaven." - Daniel is now told to go his way till the end be, for he should rest, ["Blessed are the dead which die in the Lord, for they rest from their labors."] and stand in his lot at the end of the days. Entering upon his inheritance in the new earth, with all the saints, can alone be the meaning.

## THE TESTIMONY OF N. HERVEY.

THE MARRIAGE SUPPER OF THE LAMB; TOGETHER WITH DANIEL'S VISIONS HARMONIZED AND
EXPLAINED. - BY N. HERVEY - 1842, Pages 56 \& 57: -
PAPAL ROME. - This little horn waxed exceeding great, toward the south, toward the east, and toward the pleasant land. And it waxed great even toward the host of heaven; and it cast down some of the host, and of the stars, to the ground, and stamped upon them. Yea, he magnified himself even to the prince of the host; and by him the daily (or continual) sacrifice was taken away, and the place of his sanctuary was cast down; and an host was given him against the daily, by reason of transgression, and it cast down the truth to the ground, and it practiced and prospered. Then I heard one saint speaking, and another saint said unto that certain saint which spake, How long shall be the vision concerning the daily, and the transgression of desolation to give both the sanctuary and the days* host to be trodden under foot? And he said unto me unto two thousand three hundred days.

NOTE. * - "Though literally it be two thousand three hundred evenings and mornings, yet I think the prophetic day >
should be understood here as in other parts of this prophecy, and must signify so many years." - Dr. A. Clarke.

And I heard, but I understood not: then said I, O, my Lord, what shall be the end of these things? And he said, Go thy way, Daniel; for the words are closed up, and sealed till the time of the end. Many shall be purified and made white, and tried; but the wicked shall do wickedly, and none of the wicked shall understand. But the wise shall understand. And from the time that the daily sacrifice shall be taken away, and the abomination that maketh desolate be set up, there shall be a thousand two hundred and ninety days. Blessed is he that waiteth and cometh to the thousand three hundred and five and thirty days. But go thou thy way till the end be, for thou shalt rest and stand in thy lot, at the end of the days,
i. e. the 1335 days, which commenced when the daily sacrifice was taken away, and the abomination which maketh desolate was set up.

Here two abominations are mentioned - the DAILY, and THE TRANSGRESSION OF DESOLATION: Dan. viii. 13. Both of these were desolating powers, although the latter is called, in Dan. xi. 31, and xii. 11, "the abomination that maketh desolate." The daily refers to Pagan Rome, - the transgression of desolation to Papal. The influence of Paganism, or the daily, began to decline under the agency of the preaching of the gospel, till at length, it entirely ceased, and Christianity became the religion of the Roman Empire; and Constantine gave his influence in its favor, in the fourth century. The altar of Paganism was not entirely removed from Rome, for it was not taken away till about A. D. 508, when, according to Gibbon's testimony, Vitalian, with an army of Huns and Bulgarians, mostly idolators, declared themselves the champions of the Catholic faith. Hence the taking away of the daily, or the end of Paganism. Then appears the abomination that maketh desolate, or the transgression of desolation. This abomination the Savior refers to in Matt. xxiv. 15; and speaks of its standing in the holy place, and, as Paul saith, sitteth in the temple of God. See 2 Thess. ii. 4. The holy place signifies the church, the people of God, who are called, in the Scriptures, the "holy people." It is evident that the Savior, in Matthew, alludes to the "transgression of desolation," the Papal power, and not to the "daily," or Paganism. The Papal power commenced, as we have seen, 538 , when the time of trouble, more especially, began, to the people of God. There has been great tribulation to the church during the 1260 years. "The severity of this tribulation," says a recent write on this subject, "began to be broken before the 1260 years expired; that the church was to remain in the wilderness. [See Rev. xii. 6.] The kings began to make war on that desolating power, [See Rev. xvii. 12-16,] before the whole period allotted to it had expired; and the

Reformation commenced about the same time, and thus the days in the violence of persecution were shortened, for the sake of 'the elect,' the church."

## Cauliflower Ceviche (Serves 4)

## 1 head Cauliflower

1 cup diced tomatoes
1 cup diced cucumber, peeled
1 medium red pepper, chopped
1 carrot peeled and shredded
1 Serrano pepper or jalapeno, de-seeded and minced
$1 / 2$ cup white or red onion finely chopped (to taste)
$1 / 4-1 / 2$ cup cilantro, chopped (to taste)
3 TBSP lime juice (fresh 1-2 limes)
2 Avocados (optional)
Directions:
Bring water to a boil in a large pot. Fill a large bowl with ice and water. Drop cauliflower into the boiling water and cook for 2-4 minutes. Drain cauliflower and place in the bowl with the ice water. This will shock the cauliflower and stop the cooking process. Let cool. Chop cauliflower into small pieces. In a large bowl combine the cauliflower, tomato, cucumber, pepper, carrot, onion, jalapeno, cilantro, avocado and the lime juice. Mix well. Season with salt and pepper and let marinate for 30 minutes.

Adjust seasoning and serve on top of tostadas or with chips.

Directions:
Preheat oven to 325 . Lightly grease a baking sheet or line it with parchment paper. Cream butter and sugar together until soft and well blended. Add the vanilla. Gradually add the flour, salt and pecans and mix well. Chill the dough for 1 hour (optional). Roll the dough into 1-inch balls. Place on baking sheet. Place on baking sheet. Bake about 15 minutes. They will be ready when their bottom is beginning to brown and the cookies are firm. Remove from oven and let them cool for 5 minutes. Transfer to a cooling rack. Once cool, roll in the 1 cup confectioners' sugar. Store in an airtight container at room temperature. You can freeze these cookies. You may have to roll them in confectioners' sugar again if you do freeze them.

When you make these, please remember to have me come over and taste test them before you allow others to eat them. You may want to make an extra dozen or so for my quality control process. Just kidding, but they are really delicious!

## Do you love haystacks?

If you're an Adventist (in the U.S.A., at least), you probably grew up eating haystacks (maybe even 2 or 3 times a week). Have you ever wondered about their origin? Here is a piece from an Adventist Review article on it:
"In the early 1950s Ella May Hartlein (pictured left) and her husband lived at Arizona Academy (before it became known as Thunderbird Academy), where Mr. Hartlein was dean of boys. The young family enjoyed dining out at a local Mexican restaurant, and they were fans of the tostadas. Before long the Hartleins moved to Idaho, then on to lowa, serving at an academy there. There was a clear shortage of Mexican restaurants in those locales, and the Hartleins missed their beloved tostadas.
"For a Fourth of July picnic, faculty women got together to figure out what to serve the crowd. Mrs. Hartlein, who by now had improvised and come up with a dish that would satisfy tostada cravings, had a suggestion. "I'll tell you something we've had," she said. And out came the story of how she began using Fritos for tostada shells and adding beans, lettuce, other veggies, and cheese. "So this is what I suggested to the other faculty ladies to serve at the picnic," said Hartlein. The kids thought it was wonderful, so the school adopted the recipe and served it every week.
"One of the faculty members was approached by the local newspaper to share recipes from the faculty women for a small feature article. When the recipes were turned in, this concoction of chips, beans, cheese, and veggies was labeled "Hartlein Special," for Ella May. From there the dish went forth, though it is unclear when people began referring to it as "haystacks."
"Many years later, when a local pastor first came to Sligo Seventh-day Adventist Church in Takoma Park, Maryland, where Mrs. Hartlein is a member, she introduced herself to him. He immediately asked, "Are you connected with Hartlein Special?" Clearly, the dish, and its fame, have gone far and wide, known today as haystacks, and loved the world over by many."
